<ul> <li>Ch.1.05 General Provisions</li> <li>Formerly titled "Applicability and Definitions"</li> </ul>	<ul> <li><b>1.05.015</b> <i>Public Nuisance</i></li> <li>New section, relocated from Title 2.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>This will allow public nuisances to apply to the entire Code and not specific titles or chapters.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>New name for this chapter is still undergoing review.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li><b>1.05.020</b> Definitions</li> <li>Added new definitions and updated existing ones.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>New definitions are common and important terms that appear throughout the entire Code.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li><b>1.05.030</b> Enforcement</li> <li>Removed assessment of consultant and attorney's fees.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>This is no longer needed as we are now represented by the Prosecuting Attorney's office.</li> </ul>

Ch.1.05 General Provisions (continued)	<ul> <li>1.05.050 Fee Schedules</li> <li>Fee schedules will be inserted into the Code upon BOH approval.</li> <li>Updated language identifying how fees are established, updated, and communicated to the public.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Previous Code referenced fee schedules but never codified them.</li> <li>To clearly communicate the fee schedule adoption process to users of the Code.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li><b>1.05.060</b> Service of Notices</li> <li>Updated and expanded on existing language.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Provided clarification on when service of notices are deemed effective when issued via mail.</li> <li>Consistent with other sections of Snohomish County Code (SCC).</li> </ul>

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<b>Ch.1.05</b> <i>General</i> <i>Provisions</i> (continued)	<ul> <li><b>1.05.080</b> Inspections and Right of Entry</li> <li>Updated and expanded on existing language.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Addressed previous Code's conflict with constitutional constraints regarding unlawful search.</li> <li>To clearly lay out health department employees' conduct during inspections.</li> </ul>
	<ul><li><b>1.05.090</b> <i>Jurisdiction</i></li><li>Created new section.</li></ul>	<ul> <li>Jurisdiction section makes it clear that we are still the regulatory authority for not only Snohomish County but the ~20 towns/cities within.</li> </ul>

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Ch. 1.10 Administration	<ul> <li>Temporary removal of entire chapter.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The BOH will draft its own administrative chapter.</li> <li>Advisory Council Code is no longer consistent with current SCC and applicable RCW's.</li> </ul>
<b>Ch. 1.15</b> Conduct of Hearings	<ul> <li>Removal of entire chapter.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Chapter no longer needed as we will now use the county's hearing examiner and their established procedures.</li> </ul>

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<b>Ch.1.20</b> <i>Right of Appeals</i>	<ul> <li><b>1.20.020 - 030</b></li> <li>Revised existing language.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>To provide clarity on what actions can be appealed and who can appeal the listed actions.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>1.20.040 Pre-Appeal Conference Recommended</li> <li>Revised existing Code and added new language.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>To explain and clarify how this process interacts with Step One appeal deadlines and procedures.</li> </ul>

Ch.1.20 Right of Appeals (continued)	<ul> <li>1.20.050 Appeal Procedure</li> <li>General Information</li> <li>Added in language to address the effect of the appeal.</li> <li>Relocated appellant deadline for Step One Appeals.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>To allow the Health Department's decision to still be effective until the appeal has been resolved.</li> <li>To provide a more suitable location (1.20.060, <i>Appeal Procedures – Step One)</i>, as this deadline only applies to step one appeals and not appeals in general.</li> </ul>

CHAPTERS	PROPOSED CHANGES	REASONS FOR PROPOSED CHANGES
Ch.1.20 Right of Appeals (continued)	<ul> <li>1.20.060 Appeal Procedure – Step One</li> <li>Created new subsections.</li> <li>Inserted appellant deadline for step one appeals from 1.20.050.</li> <li>Provided clarity on when the Department would issue a step one decision</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>New subsections clearly explain to the appellant how, where, and when to file a step one appeal.</li> <li>The appellant deadline for filing a step one appeal is now in the step one procedures.</li> <li>Previous Code only specified when the administrative review would be conducted by; and did not specify when a step one decision would be issued by the Department.</li> </ul>

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<b>Ch.1.20</b> <i>Right of Appeals (continued)</i>	<ul> <li>1.20.070 Appeal Procedure <ul> <li>Step Two</li> </ul> </li> <li>Removed most of <ul> <li>existing code language.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Referenced Hearing <ul> <li>Examiner's Code, where</li> <li>appropriate.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Added language for <ul> <li>burden of proof and fees.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The county Hearing Examiner now oversees all step two appeals.</li> <li>The Hearing Examiner's code (SCC 2.02) covers all step two appeals procedures, except: <i>appeal fees</i> and <i>burden of proof</i>. This has now been addressed.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>1.20.080 Appeal from Examiner's Decision</li> <li>Deleting the entire section</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The county Hearing Examiner's code (as mentioned above) covers this. This section is no longer needed.</li> </ul>

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Public Records (Ch. 1.25)	Removal of the entire chapter.	<ul> <li>Snohomish County Code (Ch. 2.51, <i>Public Records Disclosure</i>) applies to the entire county. The existing chapter is no longer needed.</li> </ul>
